PERISCOPE BECOMES A REALITY

The periscope, a Type 14, is less than 50 feet long, yet weighs a ton. It was originally destined to be a replacement 'scope aboard the *US Navy Submarine Dolphin*, a research submarine used for deep water classified tasks. Currently, the periscope is on its final voyage, making the



NC Maritime Museum at Southport its permanent home. The periscope pedestal has already arrived at the Museum and the remaining parts are expected to arrive in February. The Friends have been busy making all of the necessary arrangements needed to get the periscope ready to be on exhibit this spring. Jim Carey explains, "Just as the Southport Friends funded the majority of the renovation and move of the museum

in to its new home, the entire cost of acquisition, transportation, fabrication, and installation will be assumed by the Friends of the North Carolina Maritime Museum at Southport." The operational periscope will allow visitors to look out over the river and explore Battery, Bald Head and Oak Island. The anticipation is great. The Museum will house the only periscope available for public viewing in North Carolina.

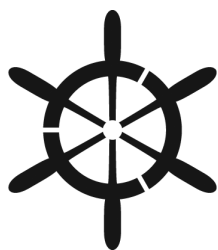
