NC Maritime Museum receives \$30,000 from Southport

The North Carolina Maritime Museum at Southport received \$30,000 from the city of Southport on Tuesday, Feb. 15.

City aldermen agreed to pay for some of the Museum's immediate needs at its future facility, including: repair of the roof, construction of a porch, and replacement of a heating/air-conditioning system.

"We view the Museum as the crown jewel of our tourist destination and our maritime heritage," said Alderman Ken Karn.

"We really appreciate what they did for

us," said Museum Friends President Walt Madsen. "This was a cooperation of local government, state government and the Friends support group. We have to build bridges like this in order to succeed."

The gift gives N.C. Maritime Museums staff the ability to prepare to open in time for tourist season – early May.

The Friends of the Museum hope to raise the remaining \$45,000 needed to complete the Fort Johnston building with their upcoming golf tournament fundraiser. The 2nd annual

Museum Golf Classic takes place on Saturday, April 2, at the Member's Club at St. James. For information or to register call (910) 253-6331.

June 3, 3:30-5 p.m.

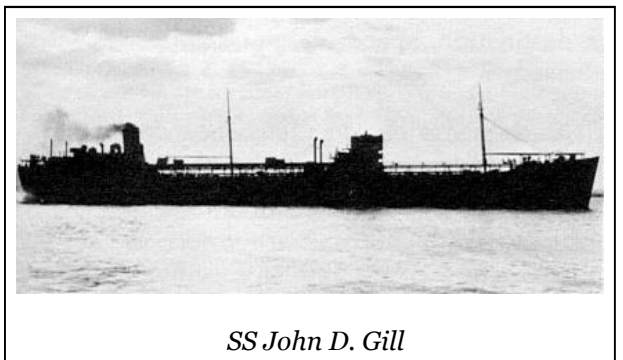
Learn about celestial navigation and constellations of the summer sky, navigational tools, make your own glowing constellation.

Combat during World War II was a lot closer than many people realize. On March 13, 1942, the *SS John D. Gill* sank approximately 25 miles off the shore of Masonboro Inlet. Twenty-three American sailors were killed. Eleven survivors spent the night at sea clinging to life rafts before being picked up by a US Coast Guard vessel from Oak Island. Many of these men were badly burned. Sixteen bodies were also retrieved. Doshier Hospital treated the survivors and housed the remains of the dead. A 15 year old Filipino man named Tingzon, who was killed in the incident, is buried at Northwood Cemetery. The "Gill" was 20,000 tons and 525 feet long. She was loaded with crude oil when caught by the German seawolf *U-158*. Several months later the *U-158* was sunk by Allied Forces just west of Bermuda. There were no survivors. The North Carolina Maritime Museum at Southport houses a few artifacts from this incident including a watch and pocket bible that belonged to Seaman Second Class Garfield C. Potts, a survivor. 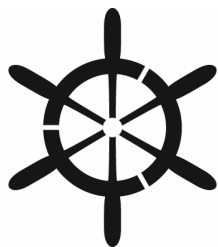
