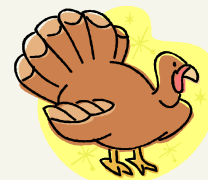
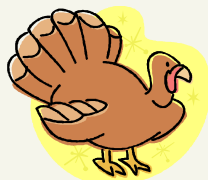
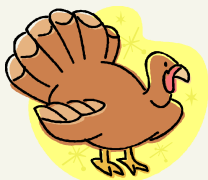
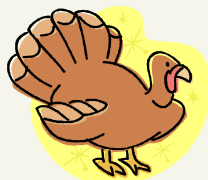




Southport Pirate Fest

Zach's Roasted Autumn Vegetables

Serving - 4-6

Ingredients Needed

1 medium sized zucchini
 1 small red onion
 1 small green bell pepper
 1 clove of garlic minced
 2 medium sized sweet potatoes
 1 small rutabaga
 2 turnips
 1 celery stalk
 2 carrots
 1 small pumpkin-acorn or butternut squash

1 teaspoon of fresh finely chopped rosemary
 2 teaspoon of fresh finely chopped parsley
 2 teaspoon of fresh chopped sage
 ½ teaspoon of fresh thyme
 ¼ teaspoon of nutmeg
 salt & ground black pepper to taste
 ¼ cup of balsamic vinegar (or cider vinegar)
 1 cup of olive oil
 1 teaspoon of Dijon mustard
 1 teaspoon of sugar

Peel and chop into bite size pieces: sweet potatoes, rutabaga, turnips, carrots and squash,

Toss firm vegetables in ¼ cup of olive oil, salt & pepper, ½ teaspoon of chopped parsley, sage and rosemary
 ¼ teaspoon of thyme and the nutmeg

As best you can, place the vegetables on a sheet pan in one layer.
 Roast in a **375 degree preheated oven** for 35 - 40 minutes

Peel onion and cut in half then slice into strips, chop green bell pepper into bite size pieces, chop zucchini into ¼ inch rounds, dice celery, add minced garlic and baby corn on the cob.

Toss soft vegetables in ¼ cup of olive oil, salt & pepper, ½ teaspoon of chopped parsley, sage and rosemary
 ¼ teaspoon of thyme

As best you can, place the vegetables on a sheet pan in one layer.
 Roast in a **375 degree preheated oven** for 25 minutes

Combine firm and soft vegetables in a large bowl- add reserved sage, parsley, walnuts and dressing, toss and serve.

Dressing:

Mix Balsamic or cider vinegar, Dijon mustard, sugar, ½ cup of olive oil, raspberry preserves.



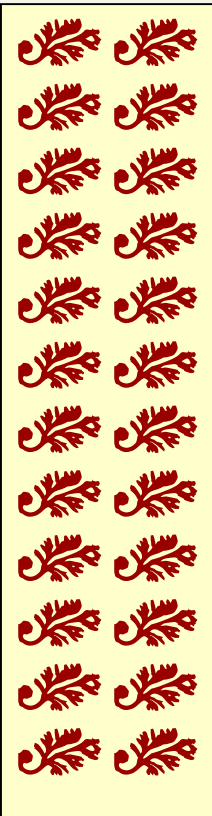
A Colonial Apparition
